



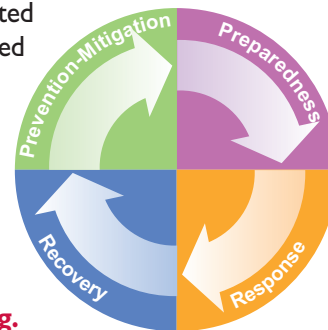

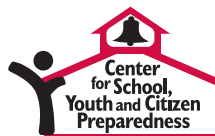
The Center for School, Youth and Citizen Preparedness is excited to announce the first in an annual series of conferences designed to prepare higher education for crisis situations.
